Sutter Holds Annual Prostate Cancer Lecture

VALLEJO, Calif.—Prostate cancer is the most common type of cancer found in American men, other than skin cancer. In fact, if you're male and over the age of 50, it's important to take a closer look at the state of your health.

Staggering Facts of Prostate Cancer

- 1 in 6 men is diagnosed with prostate cancer during his lifetime.
- Prostate is second only to lung as the leading cause of cancer deaths in men.
- An estimated 186,000 new cases of prostate cancer will occur in the U.S. this year, with the disease affecting more African American men.
- It's estimated that 28,000 of these men will die from the disease.

Recommended Cancer Screenings

Edward Levin, M.D., a board-certified urologist, says that there are few symptoms of prostate cancer, so the best ways to find it are yearly rectal exams and PSA tests. Men at higher risk—those with a family history of prostate cancer and African-Americans—should begin annual screenings around age 45. Others should start at age 50.

“We're hearing a lot more about prostate cancer in the media, and while awareness is always good, men also need to be careful of where they get their information,” Dr. Levin says. “The reality is that most patients will have excellent outcomes using standard prostate cancer treatments.”
